Lighten our Darkness was conceived as a journey from the dark times of winter and lockdown into longer, hopeful days of spring, reflected in words about nature and in music that journeys from to Lent to Easter. Little did we imagine the darkness that has descended upon Ukraine and the urgent need for hope and peace.

William Byrd's *Mass for Four Voices* was published in 1592 at a time when Catholics were persecuted in England. All three of Byrd's masses were first sung not in a church or cathedral but a house; Byrd and his wife were regular guests at Ingatestone Hall, home of Lord Petre, where the local recusant Catholics met to worship in secret - counting some very able musicians among their number, one must assume.

The movements of this 'secret' mass are interspersed by motets and organ music spanning some 450 years – and by some 21st century reflections on nature.

We are very grateful to the Rev'd Tony Cant and the church wardens of All Saints for their support as we continue to enjoy making music in this beautiful building.

When COVID-19 struck in early 2020, Writtle Singers, along with an estimated 2.2 million amateur choral singers around the country, had to find new ways to meet and rehearse. Initially, we took to our computers and got to grips with the joys of Zoom. A rendition of "Happy Birthday" for one of our basses at our first online rehearsal immediately made it clear that with differing internet speeds, singing together was not an option! But we were able to remind ourselves of old repertoire,
