

IN TUNE WITH NATURE

Thank you for joining us for a celebration of the natural world in choral music. Ralph Vaughan Williams bookends the programme: an arrangement of a simple folksong and, by contrast, three settings from Shakespeare's most magical plays: The Tempest and A Midsummer Night's Dream. From the 16th and 17th centuries we have contrasting avian offerings – Gibbons' sublime swan and Janequin's riotous dawn chorus - and Weelkes' extreme evocations of the natural world in two extravagant madrigals. From the 19th century, Fanny Hensel's expressive German part songs contrast Saint-Saëns' suave Gallic pieces. Britten's Flower Songs conjure the rugged East Anglian coast and its characterful flora whilst we are transported in a quite different way by the most recent piece, Eric Whitacre's Water Night.
