





## Summer Reflections

Thank you for joining us this evening for a programme designed to provide a little oasis in this particularly hot summer! We are delighted to welcome back our guest pianist, Jamie Cochrane. We first met Jamie when he helped us out – wonderfully – in a bit of an emergency back in 2019, when he was fresh from taking A-levels. Six years on we are so much looking forward to hearing him and making music with him once again. For our reflective programme he has chosen some beautiful pieces from Ravel's Miroirs which echo the theme of Christophe Evans' evocative Reflets de Lune, the initial stimulus for this concert. Fauré and Debussy complete the French elements of this programme of music from the last 200 years. British and German part songs are complemented by two piano duets from the USA (Beach and MacDowell), a meditative choral piece by US-based Norwegian Ola Gjeilo and, to round things off, folk and popular song arrangements by Ionathan Rathbone.

#### Jamie Cochrane piano

With playing of 'great clarity' and 'surprising strength for one so young', Jamie Cochrane is equally at home as a concerto soloist, song accompanist or chamber musician. He is keen to bring music to a wide audience, programming less widely-performed works alongside audience favourites. A Tillett Trust Debut Artist, his recent successes include first prize at the 2024 Norah Sande Award and runner-up at the Bromsgrove International Musicians' Competition 2025. Jamie has performed internationally, including venues such as the Royal Albert Hall and the Sheldonian Theatre, Oxford, and recent performances have included Rachmaninoff's Piano Concerto No. 3 with the Colchester Symphony Orchestra and Bernstein's *The Age of Anxiety* with the de Havilland Philharmonic Orchestra. He has also been fortunate to receive lessons and masterclasses from pianists such as Steven Osborne, Yevgeny Sudbin and Tom Poster, amongst others.

From 2019 to 2022, Jamie was the pianist in the Oxford-based, contemporary music group Ensemble ISIS, where he had the opportunity to work with composers Shirley Thompson and Cheryl Frances-Hoad, amongst others, as well as collaborate with and perform works by student composers. During this time, the ensemble was also involved in a recording project in connection with the Royal Shakespeare Company. Chamber music continues to be important to Jamie, and recent performances include the Brahms Piano Trio No. 3.

Born and raised in Shenfield, Jamie attended King Edward VI Grammar School in Chelmsford, where he studied piano with Tim Carey. After being crowned Essex Young Musician of the Year in 2018, he went on to study at Merton College, Oxford, where he was awarded both instrumental and academic scholarships. Having graduated with a first-class degree, he went on to hold the position of Graduate Musician in Residence from 2022-23 at St. Hilda's College, Oxford, whilst continuing his studies in London. Jamie has recently finished his Master's degree at the Royal Academy of Music with William Fong and Michael Dussek, where he was also awarded a DipRAM for outstanding performance in a postgraduate final recital. His studies were generously supported by the Wayne Sleep Foundation, Robert Turnbull Piano Foundation and the Cullis Bursary Fund.
